The *Avkat Archaeological Survey* is a diachronic survey of the region surrounding the modern village of Beyözü (also known as Avkat, and identified as ancient Euchaita,) and seeks to understand the long-term changes in landscape use and socio-economic structures found in a rural Anatolian hinterland. The project seeks to integrate traditional archaeological survey work with other disciplines into a 100% digital project incorporating large datasets both of a traditional archaeological nature, as well as non-archaeological such as large volumes of text, climatic and palynological data, and vegetational and geological classifications derived from multispectral satellite imagery. The study involves multiple simulations of transient populations (armies) moving within a digital environmental database. Alongside primary and secondary source material, the data will be used to interpret events related to warfare and resource distribution and consumption and to act as a control on the historical sources. Given the significance attributed to these events and, ultimately, the collapse of Byzantine power regionally, the lack of consensus between historians on a range of key issues concerning manpower and resources, and the route taken by the Byzantine army to Manzikert, is profound. The project involves a fundamental re-analysis of the Manzikert campaign and will illustrate the use of Grid-aware distributed simulation techniques to model movement and sustainability of historic armies. Mosaic Corpus of Bithynia and Paphlagonia 2005-

**Uytterhoeven, I.**

Since 1998 excavation and study of the building history of the late antique Urban Mansion at Sagalassos (Ağlasun, Burdur), within the framework of the *Sagalassos Archaeological Research Project* (director: M. Waelkens, Katholieke Universiteit Leuven – Belgium). The main building phase of the large elite residence under investigation goes back to the late 4<sup>th</sup>-early 5<sup>th</sup> c. AD, during which pre-existing domestic structures in the area (e.g. a 1<sup>st</sup> c. AD peristyle dwelling and 2<sup>nd</sup> c. AD private bath spaces) were incorporated in a new complex. After the 5<sup>th</sup> c. AD the building underwent several transformations, including the subdivision and the functional change of spaces. After an heavy earthquake that struck Sagalassos in the late 6<sup>th</sup>-early 7<sup>th</sup> c. AD, new occupation levels were created, until the building was finally abandoned around the Mid 7<sup>th</sup> c. AD.
